## Dr. Donald W. Gregory Patient Preparation / Instructions For Sestamibi/Cardiolite Treadmill Stress Test

## Patients walking on the treadmill for Cardiolite testing must ATENOLOL (Tenormin) METOPROLOL STOP OR (Toprol/Lopressor) 24 hours prior to the test.

## ► This test takes approximately 2 ½ - 3 hours

- 1. DRINK WATER ONLY! Do not have coffee, decaf coffee, tea, decaf tea, colas, caffeinated beverages, or chocolate of any kind for 24 hours before the test.
- 2. STOP EATING FOOD 4 hours before your test. Please continue to drink water if desired.
- 3. **Diabetic Patients**: If your test is in the morning you may get up 4 hours prior to your test to eat and take your insulin. You may take Glucose, or suck on hard candy at any time. We suggest that you bring a sack lunch. You will be instructed when you are allowed to eat.
- 4. Take all of your normal medications with water. Stop all Aminophylline, Theophylline, Excedrin, asthma medication (inhalers are o.k.) Persantine (dipyridamole), and Adenosine 24 hours prior to exam.
- 5. You may be required to walk on the treadmill for this test. Please wear comfortable clothing and tennis shoes to your appointment. No snaps or metal of any kind on shirts or blouses.
- 6. Children and pregnant women are not allowed in the Nuclear Medicine waiting room or test area at any time.

**Important Notice**: Cardiolite is an expensive material that is ordered ahead of time and cannot be reused. If you are unable for ANY REASON to come to your scheduled appointment, please call and let us know at 432-4303 extension 7165.
